

On Friday of last week, it was Orange Class's turn to lead the Primary School Assembly. We did our assembly on showing respect using our hands. Last week and this week, we frequently used our hands to show respect, communicate, and learn. We have been practising using the Switch during our number songs and to say good afternoon. We have been exploring our senses using lentils, shaving foam, and couscous but also looking at making marks and changing states. For example, adding water and other ingredients to the couscous. We have also been using our hands to explore new toys in the playground and the Big Playground, which we have not been able to use because of COVID restrictions. In Gold Class we have enjoyed learning all about plants, which means we have also appreciated the recent rain as it is helping our garden to grow. We have then continued the work in the classroom by finding out more about plants, their parts and functions and how they spread and continue growing. We learnt that flowers are pretty to attract bees which help with pollination. We also discovered that we need plants for our oxygen and to keep our world healthy. Yesterday we explored carnivorous plants which was fun. We learnt about the ways plants have adapted themselves in order to lure insects in and trap them before digesting them. We designed our own carnivorous plants with a range of ingenious traps for our prey. We even discovered that David Attenborough has a pitcher plant named after him in the Philippines which is large enough to trap rats. We have also been enjoying drumming with Alex - and are getting rather skilled at it,
