# Message from the Headteacher 28th June 2024

#### Dear Parents and Carers

What an exciting week week. Yesterday we were visited by the actress Pam St Clement, who played Pat Butcher for 26 years in Eastenders. She came as part of our 'careers encounters' programme, which is focusing on careers in the creative arts this term. Having already interviewed musician Nick Cope, and an apprenticeship specialist in school, and met with various people in their place of work, students were adept at asking questions and listening to Pam's responses. They asked her how long she had trained to be an actress and found out that there are other careers in television, such as hair and make up, and catering. Pam led a stage fight workshop, in line with her character's tendency to get into trouble, where students learnt how to do a fake slap. Students then served her tea and cake from Rosie's cafe and she was very impressed with how her order for very little milk was listened to.

We also welcomed new Early years and Key Stage One students and families to the school at our annual 'Teddy Bears' Picnic' yesterday. It was great to see so many new and existing families and to see the new children settle very quickly to play with our existing learners.

In the final week before the general election, we are holding a mock election for learners. Classes have drawn a party and are campaigning around school. We will share the results in next Friday's newsletter.

You may be awre we have a lot of illness in school currently and have a number of staff and students off with flu like illnesses (some testing positive for Covid) and a sickness bug. 

We have been doing activities around the book *From Head to Toe* with Eric Carle, which has included playing with Mr Potato Head, naming parts of our bodies and dancing and singing to Head. We have been in our waterproofs when raining and more recently, have been enjoying lots of water play to keep us cool. ## News from the Classrooms

## **Copper Class**

Our final term is flying by and Copper class have been working hard as ever. We are now very confident with class routines and are subsequently thriving. We are a great team and learners support and encourage each other.

We have continued to embrace our phonics programme and look forward to individual and group sessions daily. Our intentional sound production has come on leaps and bounds and many learners are showing much greater familiarity with a range of phonemes and their graphemes. We really enjoy playing games such as 'can you touch your...?' to develop our awareness of oral blending too.

We have taken a very hands on approach to maths during our capacity topic and are developing our understanding of concepts such as full and empty. We have worked to generalise our knowledge by exploring a wide range of stimuli, containers and contexts. From cooking, to sensory exploration and problem solving, we are improving our perception and even now applying this to contexts such as preparing our own drinks independently and carefully filling ice lolly moulds to keep ourselves cool in this warm weather.









We have also kept up with our gardening and are finally seeing the results of months of hard work. We have taken home our pepper plants that we grew from tiny seeds, and have dug up our potatoes to take home. Several learners and staff tried baking them for dinner and reported that they were delicious!

This week we took part in Wimbledon day which was a great way of embracing an upcoming sporting event. We enjoyed a range of different racket and ball activities and showed impressive coordination and aim.

Of course another upcoming event is the general election and we have been learning about what it means to vote and ensure that our opinions are recognised. The secondary classes drew lots for a political party each and we have begun to learn about the party we will represent on election day. We have worked to recognise some of the symbolism associated with our party such as their logo and colour scheme. In addition, we have been thinking about ways we can appeal to voters, consider what is important to our constituents (our Mabel Prichard community) and how to encourage others to vote for us by making making a clear choice. We will be setting up our party stand on election day next week with our 'Spongebob' yellow ballot box and a range of activities that we hope our friends will want to vote for. Oxfordshire County Council are bringing together parents and carers of children and young people with SEND across Oxfordshire and representatives from the SEND local area, including the county council, NHS Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West Integrated Care Board and the Oxfordshire Parent Carers Forum in order to share a brief update on the overall progress they are making to improve SEND services and put a spotlight on:

- Listening to the voice and views of SEND children and young people.
- Their work with mainstream schools to develop enhanced support for SEND.
- Progress they are making to improve the timeliness of education and health care (EHC) needs assessments.

Throughout the events, there will be opportunities for attendees to ask questions and provide feedback. There are 2 sessions taking place on 1st July from 12:00-13:30 or 19:30-21:00. Booking closes on 28th June. Parents and carers also have the opportunity to complete a <u>survey</u>.
