# Message from the Headteacher 12th July 2024

#### Dear Parents and Carers

We have had a wonderful week with the two summer festivals celebrating our learners' acehievements throughout the year. One of our secondary students, Julian, organised an ice cream van for both sites and there were some stunning performances from our choir and individual learners and we officially opened our sensory wall on primary. We also had Break Through Properties into secondary on Wednesday to work on our sensory garden. They cleared the whoel area and put a drop curve into one end, which has improved accessibility at both ends. The space is now clear and refreshed and is ready to start planting for the atumn harvest.

We are very much looking forward to our assemblies for the year 14s leaving us and the primary students who are moving sites to secondary next week. The secondary assembly is at 1.45pm in Titanium Class and Rosie's Cafe will be open afterwards. The primary assembly at 10:00am in the primary hall.

You will shortly receive information about your son or daughter's class and class teacher for next year. I am sure you have also seen our consultation about the expansion of the school on the primary site, which means in September we start to move away from a 'primary' and 'secondary' model to a blended model where the current primary site will blend key stage 2 and 3 over the next few years. We have a first few year 6s not moving to secondary next year in preparation for this.

Sharing the new class lists is also an opportunity to say goodbye to two of our teachers. Firstly, a goodbye to Hamish, who joined us as a Pastoral Support Worker, Higher Level Teaching Assistant and has been Green class teacher for the last year. He is moving to Iffley Academy, another Gallery Trust School and we wish him all the best but will very much continue to work with him within the Trust. Sam Butler-McLees is also leaving after nearly 4 years working in our early years/key stage 1 phase, and leading it for the last 2 and a half. Sam is moving to a special school in Swindon and we also wish her well. We would like to thank both Sam and Hamish for the work they have done with our learners and feel confident they will be a great asset in their new schools.

You will also recieve your son or daughter's annual report from their teacher next week along with a survey asking for your views of the school.

- Their work with mainstream schools to develop enhanced support for SEND.
- Progress they are making to improve the timeliness of education and health care (EHC) needs assessments.
